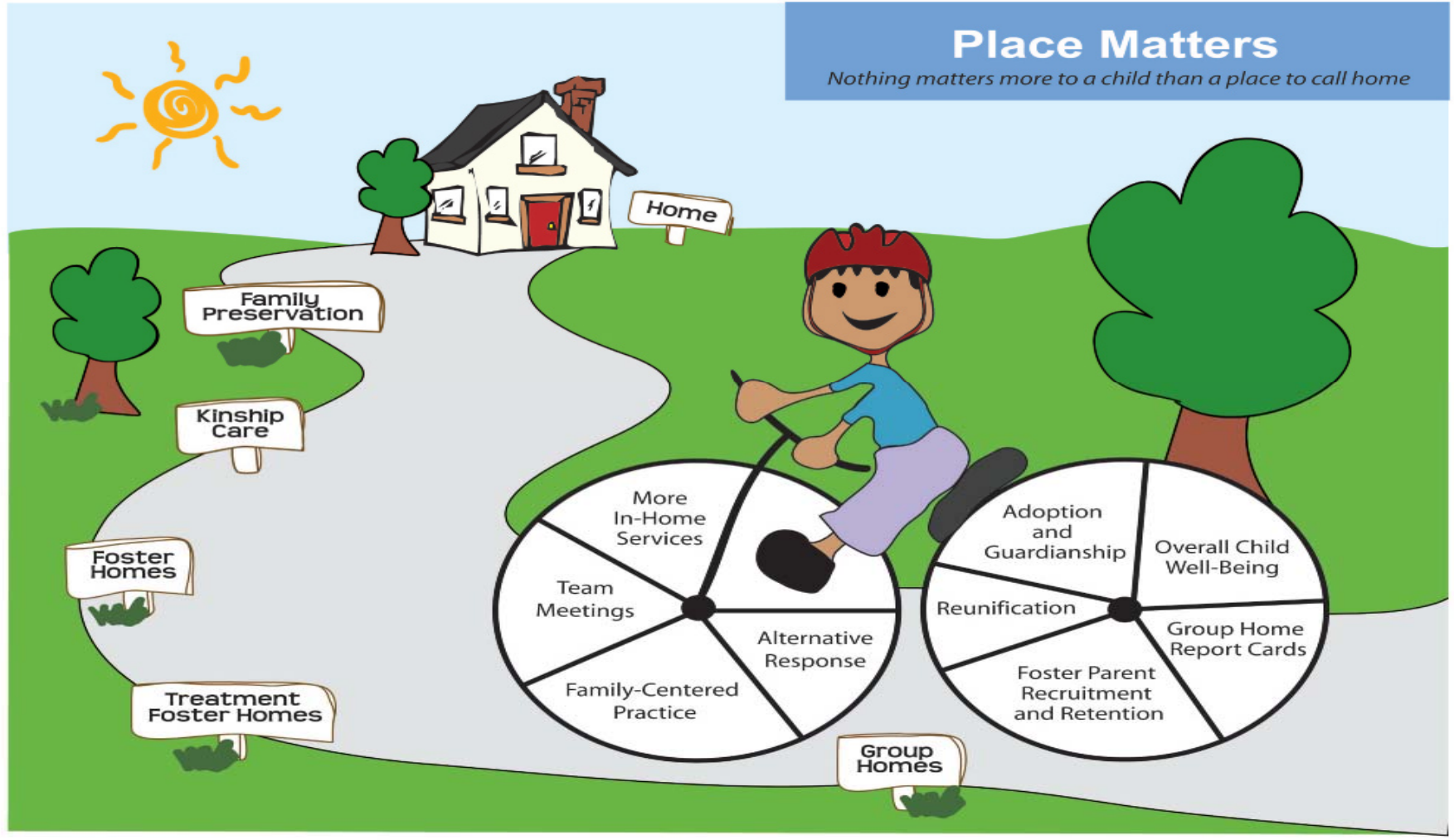

**SSA's Child Welfare Results Report**

***Purpose***

SSA's Child Welfare Results Report provides a longitudinal presentation of Maryland's child welfare results and indicators. Data presented here can be used by DHR, SSA, and LDSS staff to review how many children and families our system is serving, how well we are serving children and families, and how effective are our child welfare services. This report is designed to inform program decisions, plan for future needs, and ensure that our work is effective in helping to protect children from abuse and neglect, to strengthen families, and to increase the numbers of children that are able to safely remain home or in their communities.

***Structure***

Data in this report is organized according to the four main child welfare program areas in Maryland's LDSSs: Child Protective Services, In-Home Services, Out-of-Home Services, and Adoption. Within each of these four program areas, client population data provides information on the demographics of our client populations (age, race, and gender). After the population is described, data is presented according to the Results Accountability framework, with three main questions being addressed: How much did we do? How well did we do it? Is anyone better off? This structure allows us to examine the numbers of children and families served, our compliance to child welfare standards, and, most importantly, the outcomes for the children and families we serve.

***Data Sources***

Information presented here comes from the Maryland Children's Electronic Social Services Information Exchange (MD CHESSIE) and from LDSS State Stat reports. MD CHESSIE data used in this report are extracted by the MD CHESSIE developer (Affiliated Computer Services, Inc.) and by the University of Maryland Baltimore - School of Social Work. This report is compiled by the DHR/SSA Research and Evaluation unit in collaboration with the DHR Office of Planning and Performance. Due to ongoing data cleanup, counts from MD CHESSIE and LDSS State Stat reports may differ.

***Fixes, Fine Tuning, and New Features***

*Correction* - In-Home Services - Among children who had an indicated or substantiated finding of abuse or neglect, and received Family Preservation Services, the percentage who remained in their home for 12 months - numbers and percentages were revised due to error in query analysis

*New Indicators* - Out of Home Services - Two new indicators were added: Placement Stability - children in OOH placement 12 - 24 months, and 8 days - 12 months, with 2 or fewer placement settings in the 12 month time period ending in the quarter indicated

*New Charts* - Out of Home Services - Absence of Maltreatment in Foster Care, Reunification within 12 Months, and Re-entry into OOH Care within 12 Months of Reunification

***Feedback***

This is a new report, intended to be an improvement over the traditional SSA Monthly Management Report. We believe that it is a good start, but know that improvements can be made as we move forward. ***Future***

We are currently developing indicators for the "how well did we do?" section for In-Home Services, and the "how well did we do?" and "is anyone better off?" sections for Adoptions. In addition, we are also revising the jurisdictional data section of this report to combine data which is used in the Continuous Quality Improvement process; look for this addition in the next edition of the CWRR!

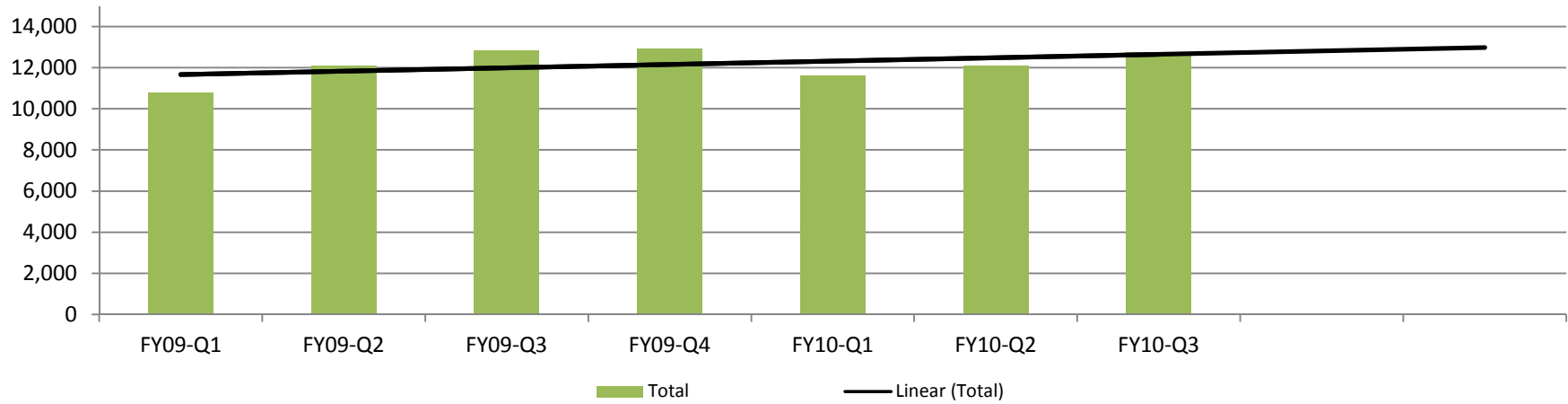

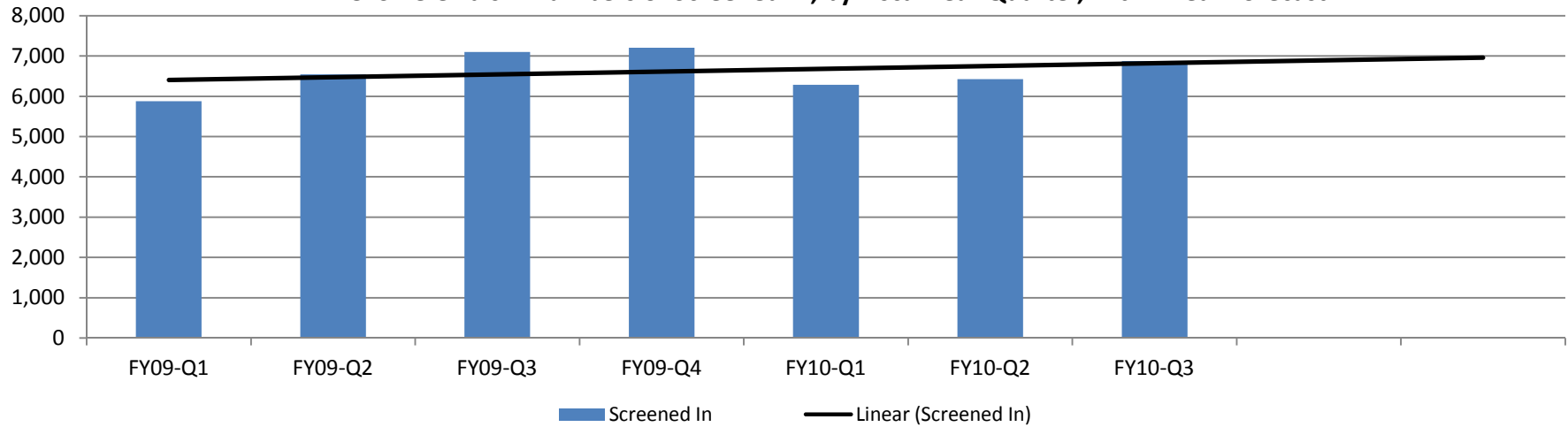

**CPS Referrals - Total Number of Referrals, by Fiscal Quarter, with Linear Forecast**



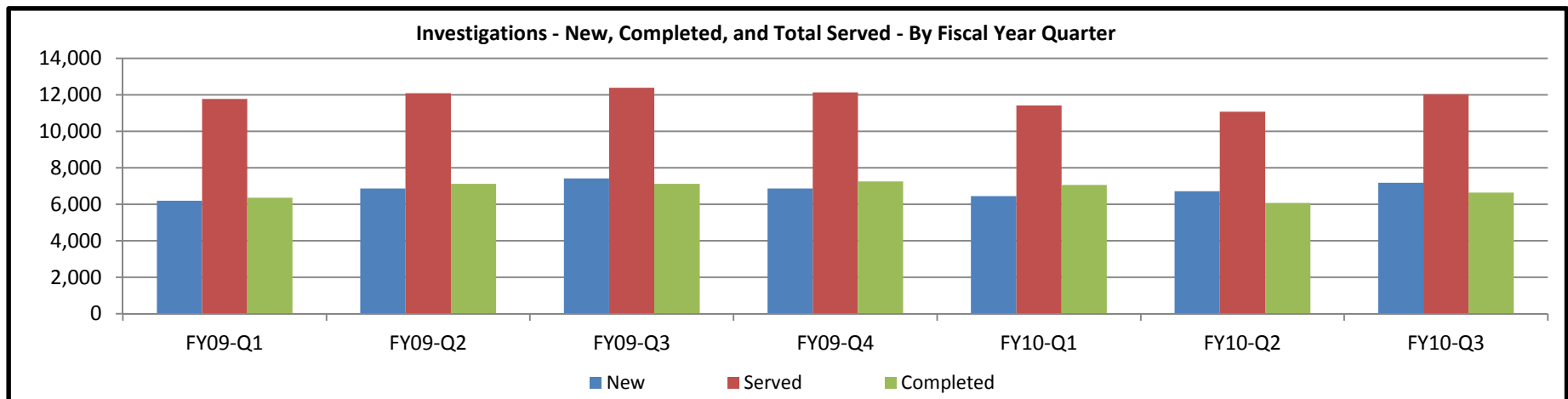
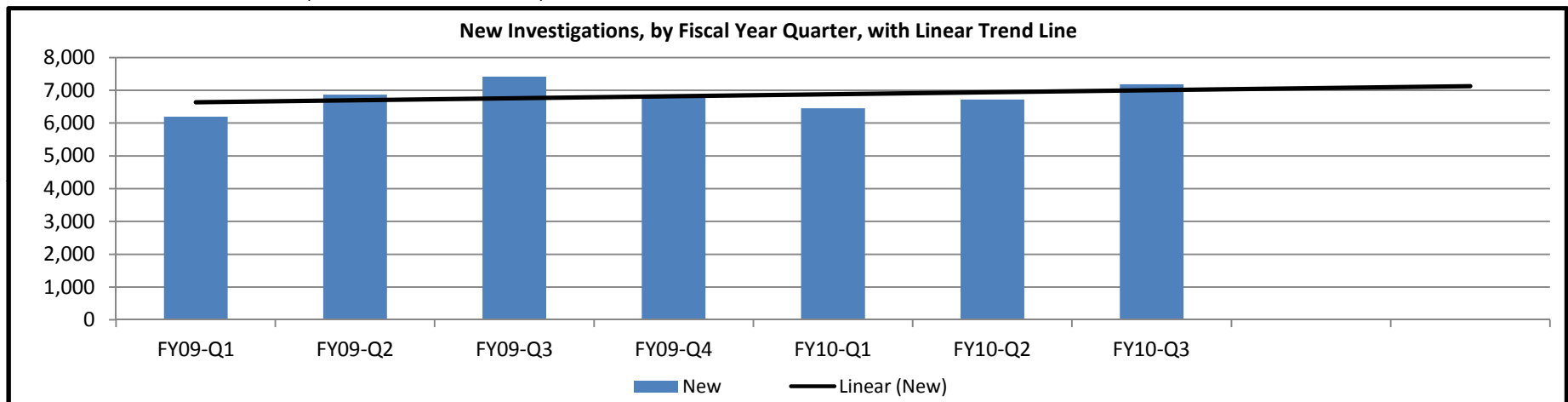
**CPS Referrals - Numbers of Screened In, by Fiscal Year Quarter, with Linear Forecast**

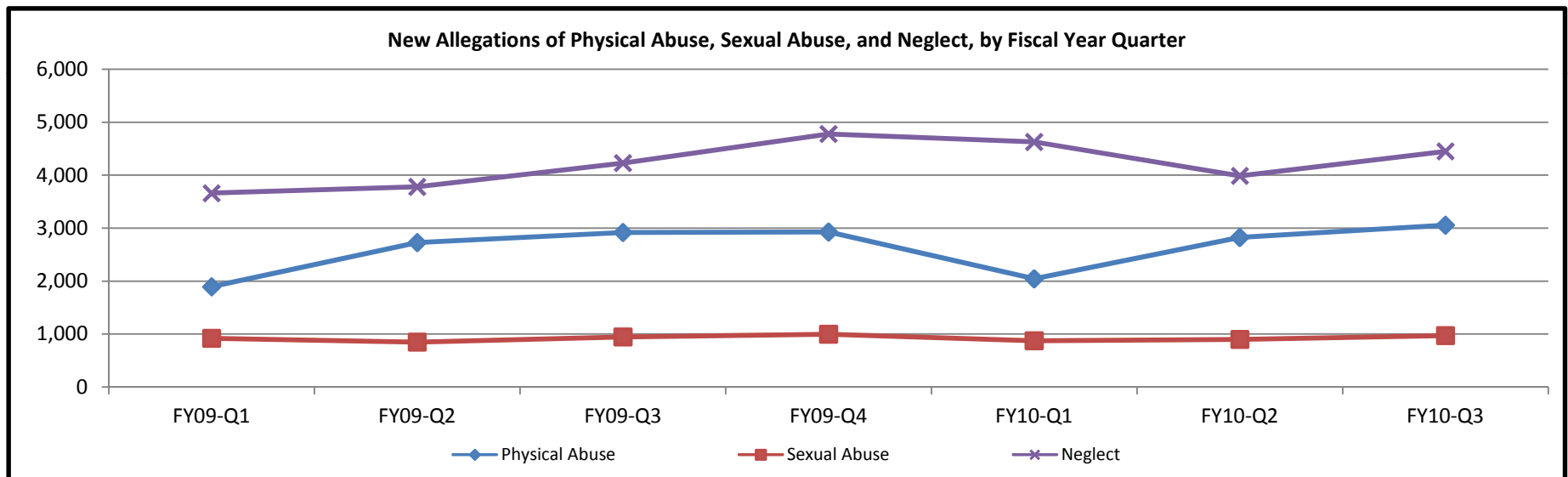

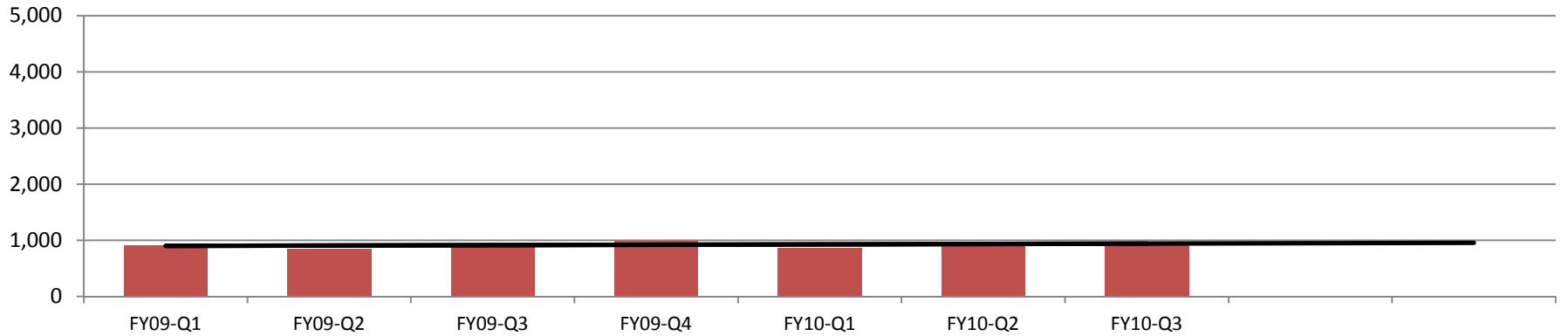
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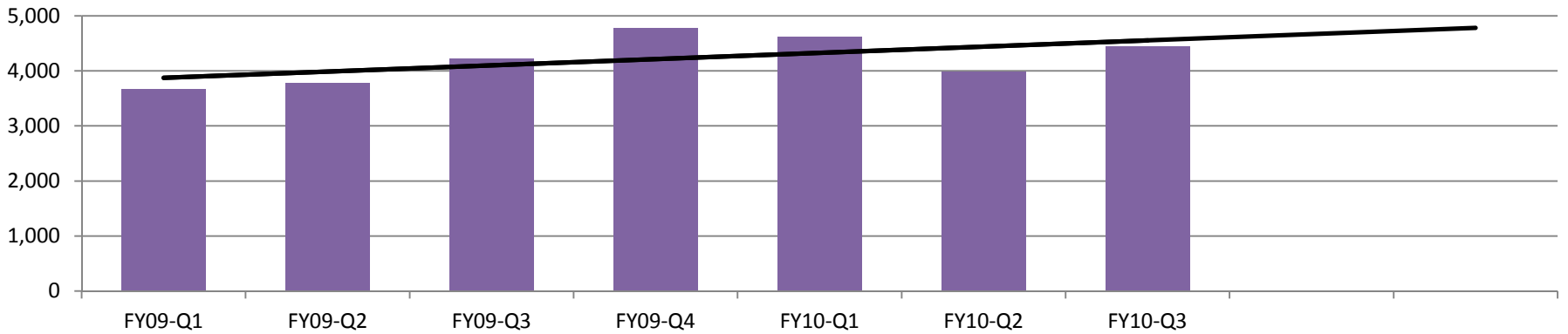
**New Allegations of Physical Abuse, by Fiscal Year Quarter, with Linear Forecast**



**New Allegations of Sexual Abuse, by Fiscal Year Quarter, with Linear Forecast**



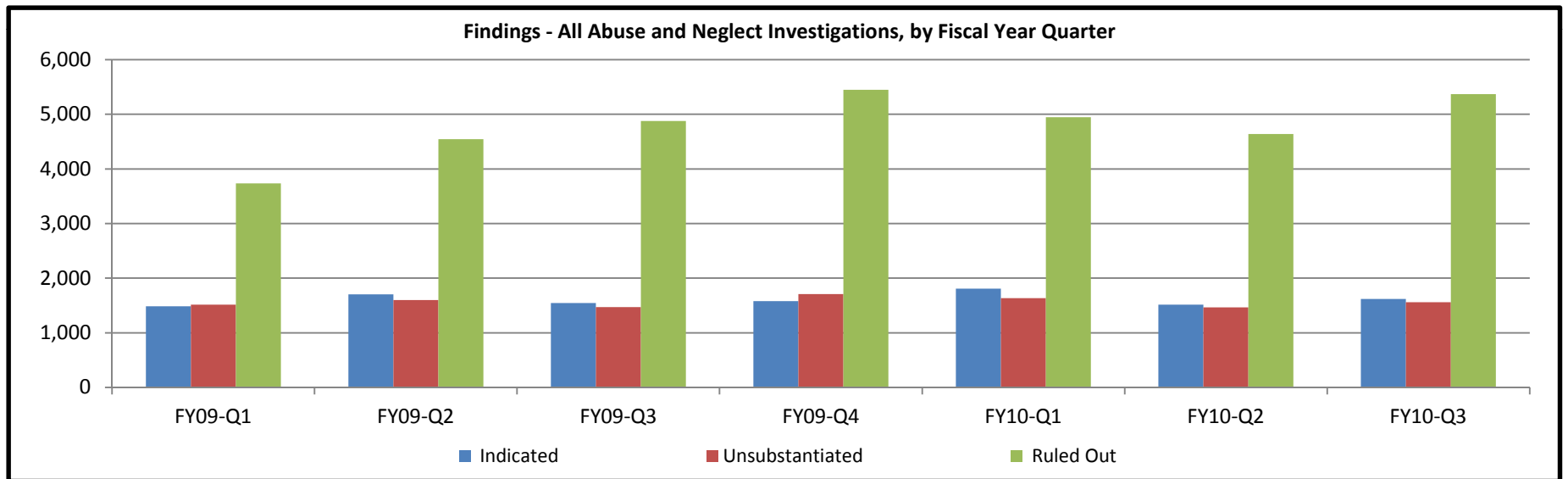
**New Allegations of Mental Abuse, by Fiscal Year Quarter, with Linear Forecast**



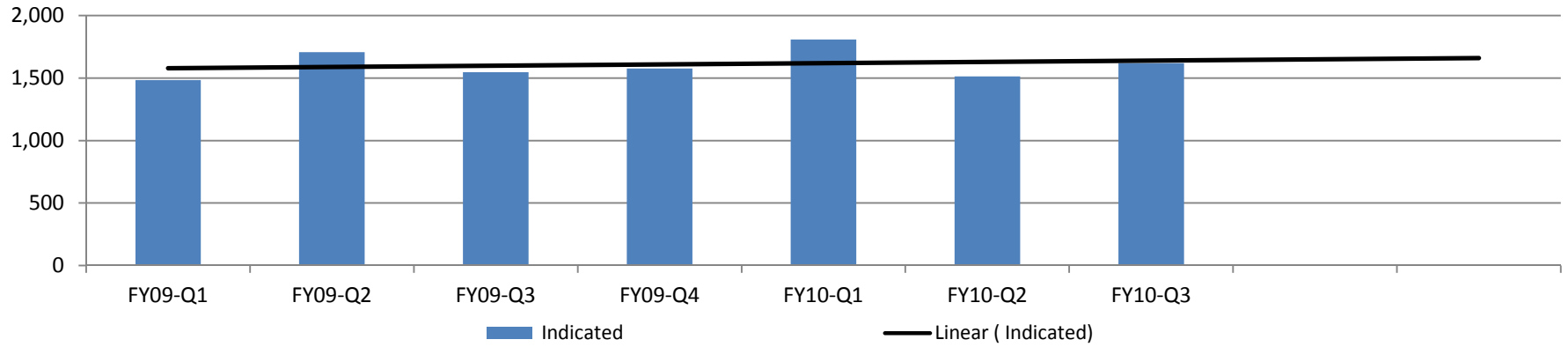

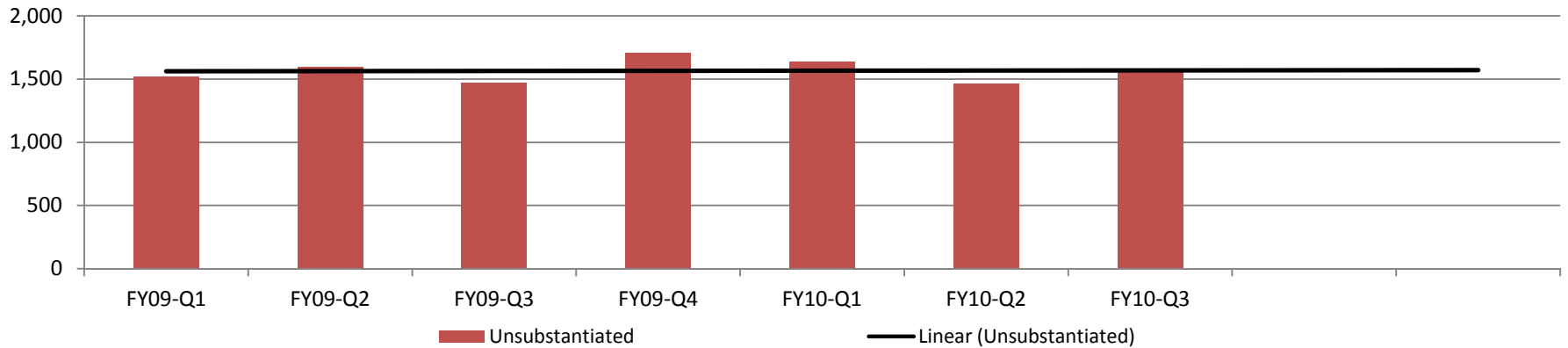
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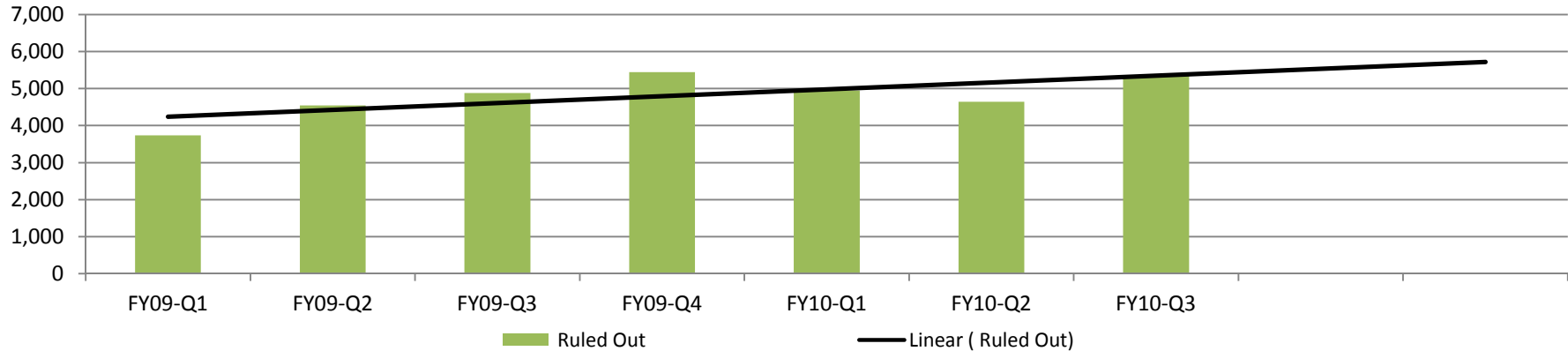
Findings - All Indicated Abuse and Neglect Investigations, by Fiscal Year Quarter, with Linear Forecast

Findings - All Ruled Out Abuse and Neglect Investigations, by Fiscal Year Quarter, with Linear Forecast

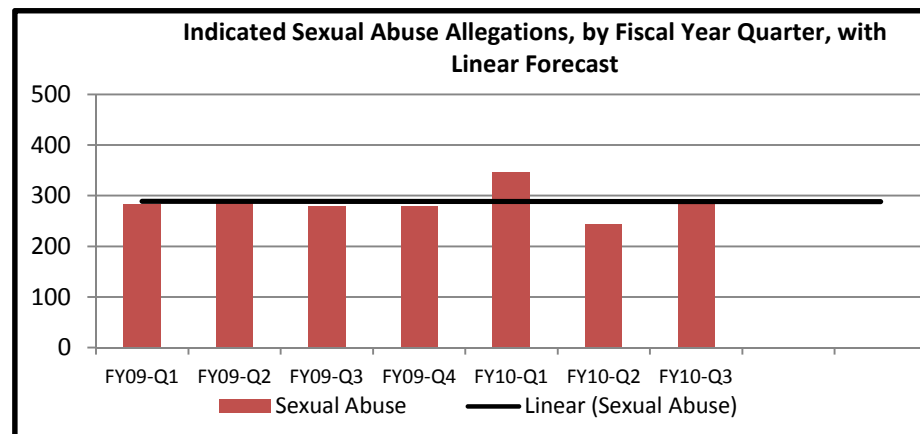
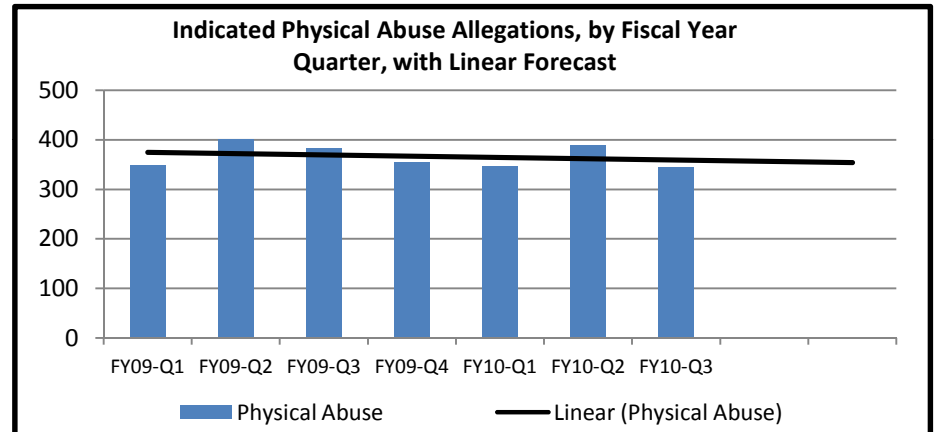
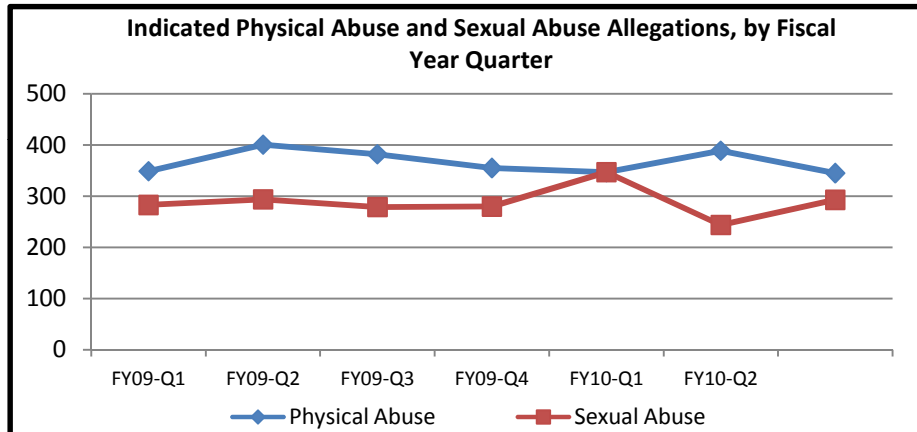

**Clients 18 years of age and above receiving In-Home Services on 3/31/10**



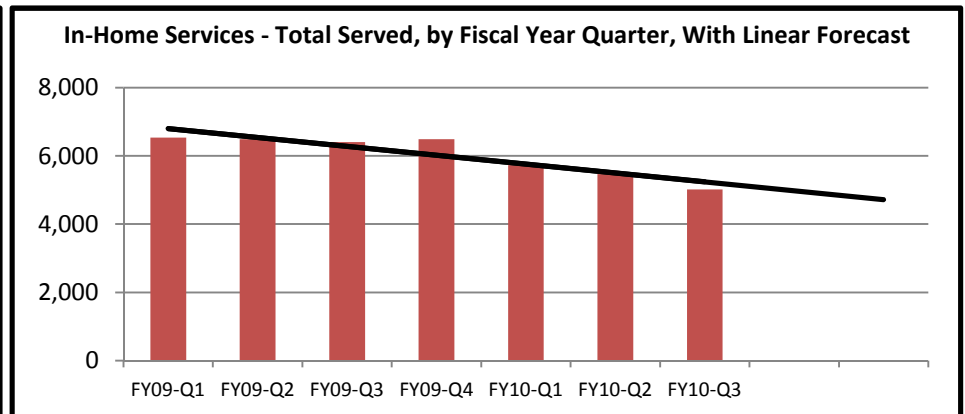
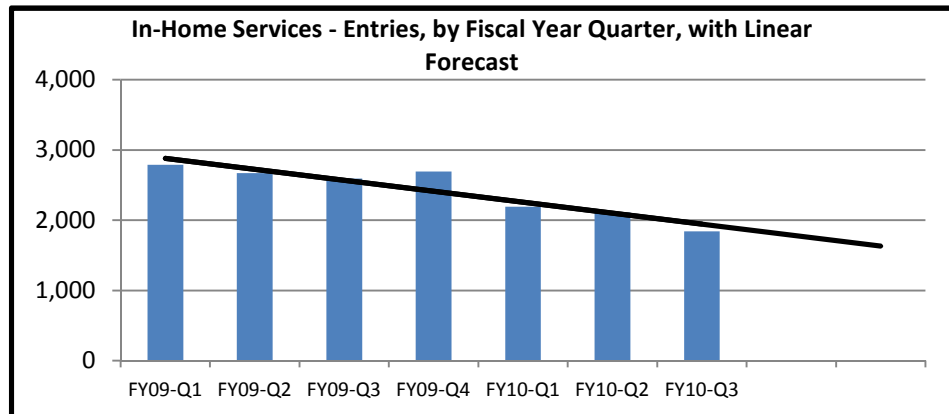
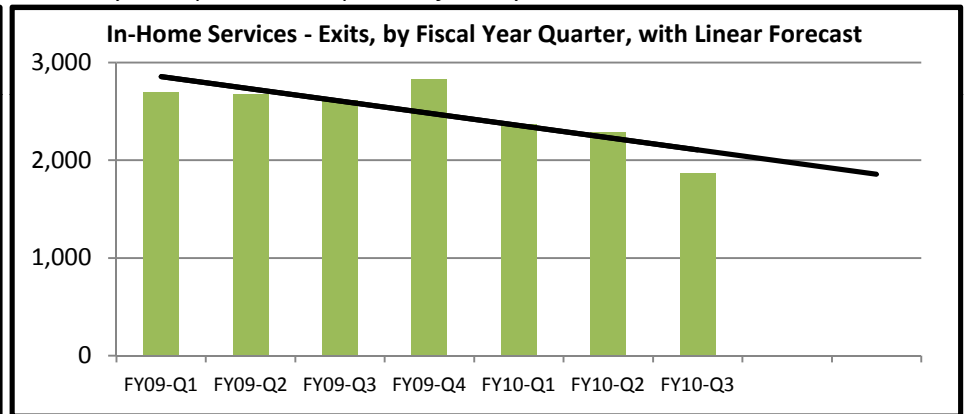
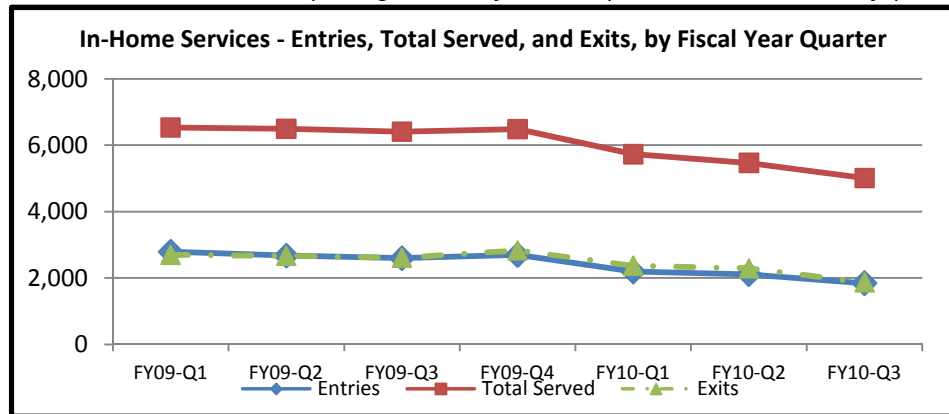
